A Personal Statement typically covers the following topics, but may diverge:

- Which research questions are you interested in?
- How did you come to be interested in these research questions, and why do you think they matter?
- Why is the MPS of Cognition is a good fit for you?
- Why are you a good fit for the MPS of Cognition?
- Which previous practical experiences and skills have you already acquired that will set you up for a successful PhD?

If you do not currently have access to academic advisors for your application and need support, we recommend that you take part in our Applicant Support Program to receive individual feedback and advice on your application documents (Personal Statement and CV) by a student of the school. We will announce the start of the Application Support Program on our website during the application period in fall.
